The ABC STEP program uses its own 20 key components to safety and health, as well as Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standards and reporting requirements to evaluate members' safety and health performance. A self evaluation of Mobil Steel's safety and health program confirmed that the local steel fabricator meets guidelines of the ABC STEP program and demonstrated Mobil Steel's commitment to safety and health through development and analysis of structured safety and loss prevention programs, and training to reinforce safety programs.

Bedell, President and CEO of Mobil Steel. "STEP is a proven and valuable resource that helps ABC members develop and improve safety and training efforts," Bedell added.

In 2013, ABC STEP participants performed better than Bureau of Labor Statistics national averages in safety performance metrics. According to ABC, safety performance helps participants benefit in the pre-bid and bid process for securing work and when negotiating cost-effective insurance rates.

"STEP is a world-class standard for health, safety and environment in the construction industry," said Russell Hamley, president of ABC Houston. "It embodies leadership commitment from members like Leonard Bedell, and develops a culture within our member companies where each employee is accountable for the safety and well-being of all employees."

The STEP program was established in 1989 by the ABC National's Environment, Health & Safety (EH&S) Committee and developed and written by contractors for contractors. The program provides companies tools to improve safety with a goal to send every construction industry employee home in the same or better condition than which they arrived. Safety tools include sample safety manuals, safety plans, job safety and job hazard analysis, safety presentations, safety posters and job safety videos. The resources are developed by ABC members and partners.
